Are you interested in dipping your toes into some water based adventuring? If so, this is the class for you! In Primary Strokes our American Canoe Association (ACA) certified instructors will introduce you to fundamental kayaking skills like proper boat and PFD fit, carrying and lifting techniques, efficient forward and reverse strokes, and several maneuvering strokes including sweeps, draws, and rudders. This 3 hour class takes place in a protected and calm water environment best suited for learning basic strokes. For full day instruction that includes basic strokes and adds rescue technique, see Strokes and Rescues Course.

RT 50 East - Go over the Bay Bridge
At RT 50/301 split (approx. 10 miles after Bay Bridge), stay to the left - will become RT 301
Left onto 18 East (Main Street)
7109 Main Street - just past the bank, on the left, behind the Queenstown Inn B&B
